The joy of Christmas in our « Home »

This is an appointment that is renewed every year: the birth of our Savior who comes to give us life, His life! And we try to live out of His life in the Home of Tenderness, doing our best to respond to his call, He who gives us Joy in its fullness.

It is in the joy and love that our young people with disabilities live their daily lives and especially the Christmas period ... but what about the members of the team? Those that are usually found in their "work area" office or other, how do they live Christmas in this great family? This year, between expectations and nostalgic memories, they are the ones who tell us about their experiences...



Laughter, joy, affection, friendship, intimacy, family ... are the words mentioned by team members to express their feelings at Christmas.

"Feeling Christmas is welcoming our friends throughout the month of December. The laughter of schoolchildren, the loving presence of volunteers, the touching discovery of companies or movements members, that come with their gift, all these, made our "Home" a joyful hive full of life, that only rests a few hours to start better...

Feeling Christmas is building friendships: by taking care of each other, we are happy to please our "secret friend ", especially if that friend is one of our young people who cannot pay it back "materially".

Sharing this time with our young is to live "Christmas together" in a day that brings us together with the ladies of the Committee: and it is wonderful to see the enthusiasm of these, while they play with our young people and sing along, easily and with a carefree joy.

Sharing this time with our young people is going in their home, and bringing them "Living Jesus" in the Holy Host, since they would not be able to leave their homes to welcome Jesus even during that night, because of the heaviness of disability.

Enjoying Christmas is to see our young people happy and sharing their joy with others: last year, accompanied by seminarians, they were in the center of Jounieh; they moved passers singing accompanied by the darbuka and giving them a "Word from the Gospel"...

Enjoying Christmas is seeing our young people put all their heart to make beautiful designs that would ultimately beautify our greeting cards. It is to see them happy to be helpful in preparing the Christmas greetings for our friends in Lebanon and elsewhere.

Living Christmas is enjoying a glance, a word, a smile of our youth: it is to see Marcelle smiling to each and everyone, to see Adla distribute kisses, Joey hugging a schoolboy, Philippe overcoming his difficulties; it is to contemplate the angelic face of Kiko



Christopher; it is hearing Samo saying I love you, do not be afraid "Halet" *Hayete* (darling)!

Living Christmas is to be present in all gratuity for each other. It is to be marveled, while giving thanks for the beauty and joy that we live despite the poverty of each. It is to find back ourselves, acknowledge our sin, and depart again with a light heart. It is to go beyond sad memories to make others happy. It is to be comforted by Jesus, Host, present among us and in us. »

Below are some testimonies collected...

- How was the ladies' committee formed?

It was in response to Yvonne's call that all started: Ya reit fi comité (if only we had a committee)! This first step was due to the Virgin Mary that attracted us all.

- What touched you most?

To see the young people happy where they are, to see them happy despite the difficulties, despite their disabilities is really moving. It is thanks to Yvonne who sowed in them that breath. For the able-bodied, it's a great lesson!

On the other hand, we notice in Anta Akhi a very strong spirituality and piety, next to the comprehensive care for the young people. We see that it would not be possible to move forward without the intervention of

Mary.

- Have you noticed a change of mentality towards the world of disability in your community?

Our friends know more Anta Akhi; they sympathize with people suffering from disabilities, are more sensitive to their cause, and are touched by their lives.

- The ladies of the committee seem very united...

Yes, basically, we are a prayer group. We have beautiful relations between us, based on a spirit of simplicity: there is no president, no leader, we are a family.

- After all these years, you are still present:

Our young people need us ... it's true that there are difficulties, but we do not give up,



we will not be discouraged. We do what we can for their good.

Every human being has a disability somewhere, we all need support, whether physical, mental, emotional or spiritual, and we cannot ignore a person who has a lack, cannot not walk... As Christians we are present here by love, not for any human glory.

- Thank you...

There is no need to thank us. It's the least we can do; we give as we can and we will not give up. We love you all!

- We love you too...

« Life is beautiful with *You, my brother* »

Marie Béthouart, a French volunteer, decided to share the lives of our young people for 3 months. Her discreet and loving presence, her willingness to help where need be, and her internalization of all she lives here, leave to all of us who live in the Home of Tenderness, a beautiful testimony of gratuity.

I had often heard of Anta Akhi, this home located in Lebanon near Beirut hosting people with disabilities but I was not a priori attracted by the "world of disability," I thought it was not my "charisma". In 2013, I was offered again to discover their way of life. Maybe it was the lure of travel, and the curiosity to discover the country, that led me to accept the proposition. I said yes to a trip in an eastern country, however, I quickly realized that I had actually said yes to an inner journey. A few days were enough to make me realize that between able-bodied and people with disabilities something true, something more powerful than disability, something I was not yet able to define, was attracting me.

In September 2014, I decided to return to Anta Akhi and to stay longer. Now it's been over a month that I live here every day. I work during the day in the existential training. I'm happy to take time for spiritual reading but I understood that it was not about raising knowledge. What young people and everyone in the house helped me to understand is that nothing is more important than knowing I am a beloved child of the Father, loved for myself, called to love in return because I'm created for it.

This is the strength of the testimony of the young people who prove that despite the limitations of the disability and difficulties in everyday life, life is not doomed and therefore we are not condemned by our limitations; we can achieve happiness! The secret to achieving this is to make the choice of love in all my relationships and my actions.

What makes all the difference in Anta Akhi is that my faith in my Christian life that was often only theoretical is rooted in the everyday's life and makes sense. What I read about the importance of love and self-giving, I can actually apply through all the requests, all the requirements of community life, following the example of all the people of the Home who try to live it. Young people never cease to amaze me with their openness to others and generosity; they are never tired of asking me how I am, what I did, how was my day. They give a lot of themselves and thus push me to give myself, to forget myself and therefore to be happy and make others happy.

It is by sharing the tasty dishes of the Lebanese cuisine that I understood the secret recipe that gives so many flavors to life: love received and given, love shared,



that gives small gestures another flavor, and takes life on another dimension; I decided to take seriously my life with God and therefore my life with others.

This emphasis on everyone's life is daily expressed also by the way I am welcomed, like any other visitor, by the particular attention given to my needs and the resources invested to make my stay pleasant in order to grow, and make love grow in this "living together".

However, it takes very little time to realize the difficulty of being faithful to this gift of oneself day after day. But again, all is not lost; I continue learning, to recognize that the world of the unseen is actually present and active. I believe that in deciding to do our part with our limitations, our imperfect and small means, Mary, Queen of the Impossible and the Holy Spirit will do their part and make it possible to live together in peace, joy and serenity everywhere, always and in everything."
