
# Our life at Anta Akhi

## At midnight...

It's so beautiful to get united, young adults with disabilities and members of the team to celebrate « Christmas together », it's also beautiful to visit our young adults who are home-based, the 24<sup>th</sup> of December to bring them Jesus Alive in the Holy Sacrament. All Christmas atmosphere carries joy: the reception of friends, the singing, the animated evening...but mostly, Christmas is about the birth of our Savior, and at the Home of Tenderness, we wait Christmas night to give thanks for the incarnation of Jesus...

He made himself the smallest! And the disability makes of us small people in the eyes of the society. But through His smallness, He raised us and we recognized our greatness of sons, children of God. Vreij, Johnny and Imad, suffering from multiple disabilities who preceded us to the father this year, weren't they seen as small by the world? Who can say what greatness, what joy, they are enjoying today?

He was completely vulnerable, depending on his parents, as a new-born... If a child gets self-sufficient bit by bit, our young adults stay dependent of the able-bodied. What would Mikael become without his life companion? Christopher? Carole? Mélanie? They are unable to live without the presence of able-bodied persons to their side.

**He was poor,** he was born in a manger. Our young adults live inside the great family Anta Akhi, and they have no possessions...But even before speaking about material possession, isn't the society that qualified them as « poor » and put them in this category just because of their disability. How many times did Tony, Philippe, Rita, Marianne, hear people say: « Oh how unfortunate he/she is! ». But after all, isn't this lack of possession, the true wealth?

**They wanted His death;** he should have not even come to life! How many embryos are eliminated today, especially if a disability is suspected? Then what, Fadi shouldn't have been born? Claire?

Mirna? Samo and Aïda? Their wonderful life testimony isn't enough to say that every life must be lived as a celebration?

And there was Mary... who stood next to Him... she didn't understand but kept all those things in Her heart... And our young adults' parents didn't understand why. Why them, why their child. If the answer to this question seems hard at birth, maybe they will have an answer later? By looking at the cross? As a road to the resurrection?

But we are still at Christmas and we celebrate it in joy. It is midnight, we are all gathered around Jesus, in this living stable that Anta Akhi is... the bell rings... the mass starts... The bread turns into Christ's Body, this bread that reminds us of Ghassan, Barbara, Marcelle, Elie, Pierre and so many others: Its shape doesn't express its essence. And our young adults, should we limit them to their disability? Are they their disability? Isn't their nature to be humans, children of God, brothers of Jesus born today in our heart and in our life? Brothers of The One they assimilate so much in this holy night? Merry Christmas! Christ is born Alleluia!



# SOS! Joy of a call! At the dawn of our 25<sup>th</sup> birthday

In today's society, we come across multiple crises, at the economic and values levels: possessions have become more important than "being". It becomes tempting and easier to fall back on ourselves and our relatives, to save our life and our goods.

Despite this reality, I would like to talk about the beauty of our society, this beauty we experimented during the two months of July and August, very hard for Anta Akhi's survival. ## Following the launch of our call, some initiatives in Lebanon and abroad

We give thanks for every member of the great family of Anta Akhi. Your testimonies of solidarity are numerous, and your love was marvelously translated in acts.

When Roula, gathered in a meeting our little family, young adults with disability and members of the team, she told us the situation, we noticed great proves of love: the young adults doubled their prayer, 12 new sponsors have been found thanks to the members of the team, the income of days of work outside Anta Akhi have been offered. The ideas emerged from everywhere! All our family was mobilized!

Our friends outside Lebanon also answered positively to our call. We don't know what they have sacrificed to help us, but we received a really touching letter with a donation of 1000 through a friend that states: "In the day of the 43<sup>rd</sup> anniversary of our daughter Claire, we send this check. We thought our backyard deck, which we wanted to remake after 38 years of effective and loyal services, could wait until next year. Greet all the team of Anta Akhi, encourage them as well."

The Anta Akhi ladies' committee, for its part, met in our offices and gave us a full availability: "What can we do to help?" The ladies decided to do the "Cinema" activity which consists in the reservation of all the movie theaters in a mall and give the profit to Anta Akhi.

Dear friends, you confirmed us more and more that our Father, through Mary, Set el beit, *Mother of our home*, watches over His children: it is true that we have every months the right amount to cover our expenses, but isn't it us who repeat every day with a lot of confidence: "Give us this day our daily bread." Well, it appears that the Lord is really mindful to our prayer...

## Flashs of our family's life

- **Archbishop Jean-Pierre Cattenoz** from Avignon did his 7<sup>th</sup> stay at Anta Akhi to help us think deeper about the project Anta Akhi and Handicap and Life in Church, and familiarize our young adults and Anta Akhi's team with the Word of God.
- We welcomed **4 priests from Togo** for a one month stay last July, as part of the project Handicap and Life in Church -Growing together. Their stay among us allowed them to familiarize with the existential training, and to put in place the practical steps to initiate a change in their parishes.
- Still as part of the training and the Handicap and Life in Church project, **Elisabeth Chaumont**, a French volunteer got back to her country after 5 years spent among our family. A big thank you « Babette » for your faith in our mission and for all the love you put in what you did.
- Our **summer camp** which has been planned in Kfifane, was finally conducted in the Home of Tenderness; this didn't prevent us from living 2 months of daily celebrations: the young adults, with their parents, brothers and sisters, friends, and volunteers from Lebanon and abroad.
- For our 25<sup>th</sup> celebration, a small group which represents our young adults, team members, friends, made a visit to the **Presidential Palace**, welcomed by the First Lady, Mrs. Nadia Aoun, and greeted by the President, General Michel Aoun. It is Fadi (who doesn't see, hardly hears and is in a wheelchair) who mostly moved the audience by claiming loud and clear: "Life is beautiful".
