Did the life of Vreij have a meaning? Was it worth living?

Vreij, young adult with multiple disabilities - left us to the world of the Father on December 29, 2015 at the age of 28 years. Although he did not speak, and even if he lived his youth in his house, unable to be moved because of the heaviness of his disability, Vreij's life had meaning ... Below is an experience few days before his death.

"Vreij entered our lives and changed them."

From the letter written by Amelie to her friends in January 2016

"The New Year Celebrations were beautiful. On Christmas Day we went with a small team to meet young adults with disabilities and their families, that are not able to participate in the Christmas Mass. We were a small team of eight, accompanied by a priest who was giving the Communion, and Santa Clause. The atmosphere was full of joy and simplicity. I realized that some young adults never leave their beds as their handicaps are heavy and as their living places are unsuitable for their needs. I think of Vreij who lives on the 4th floor and cannot enter the elevator that is too small for him. When we got home, his mother and sister received us in their living room. They accompanied 115 in their room. The beds surrounded а mattress on the floor on which Vreii was laying. His face and his eyes were bright. He seemed pleased and surprised



by our visit. With Sveta, a Ukrainian volunteer, we squat next to him. He held my finger, and kept on looking and smiling to the image of the Virgin that I showed him. Vreij entered our lives and changed them just in one meeting; he opened our hearts and our eyes.

I send you my kisses, and wish you a happy feast of the Epiphany and entrust you Vreij in your hearts and / or prayer, I just heard that he answered God recalled him.

The Operational Team with and for our young adults

A team of 56 people are present for our young adults with disabilities. So you can get to know us, we're happy to present to you, through this newsfeed and the upcoming ones, the various units of the team. We will start with the heart, with these people present with and for young adults, which form the operational unit.


Our team, composed of 17 persons, is in action every day, 24/7 to ensure a continued presence for our young adults who can not in any way be alone. For this, three shifts are in order, day, night, and during the weekend.

With our young adults limited by disabilities, we create a family, an environment that allows us to live with dignity in everyday life, as human being and children of God. It is in this living together that each of us flourishes. Despite our differences; we share our joys, our sorrows, our limitations and potentials, overcoming the difficulties of everyday life.

Our days are very diverse, despite the fact that 64% of our time is for the daily care - basic needs, medical and rehabilitative needs. This time may seem excessive, but is in particular due to the heaviness of disability and lack of independence of our young adults. The other 23% of the time meet the development needs, between activities in the Home of Tenderness, outings, welcoming friends ... as to the remaining time, or

13%, it is for spiritual and existential needs: indeed, to live together in beautiful complementarities despite our differences, the support, based on the Word of God is needed. It is a journey in which everyone, young adults and team, is committed to working on oneself. Each individualizes the training received, to see his limits, accept them, try to change, so that we can be true witnesses of peace and joy in everyday life.

Note that this training is not limited to the values of our Home of Tenderness, it encompasses everything you need to know about young adults and disability: the types of handicap of our young adults, the best approach for each young adult, optimizing our presence with them, how to preserve their dignity in everyday life.



For our work to bear fruit, coordination and sharing our experience is necessary with other units: logistics, administrative...

Note that our action would be incomplete without the partnership we have with the parents of our young adults. We are committed to an effective presence of the parents, siblings, whether in Anta Akhi or at home, for the link to be maintained and well fed. It is through their first family that emotional balance is achieved, and that our young adults continue to receive the love.

Being part of the operational team, means a daily celebration with the young adults, in which each party makes an effort to live the most beautiful moments and appreciate the wonder that is called to be, the wonder he already is!

A beating Heart

She charmed our young adults and the team with her presence, her smile, her joy of life and love. Amélie, a French volunteer, said to be splashed with light, joy and peace of our youngsters, but the reality is that she added a note of freshness, sweetness and love for the life of our young adults. Thank you Amélie!

I'm in half of my time here. It's been three months since I had the joy and the privilege of living in this home, my home.

When I arrived, I could not move forward. My legs couldn't carry me because of the weight of some sufferings that became too heavy to continue walking. My heart was broken but it was still beating. I felt disabled and I needed help to learn to live with these disabilities.

After changing my career, I graduated last July in special education. My personal experiences made me unable to do this job. I needed time. Need to recharge myself. I looked for a school of life to train me as I wanted to take the time to live, to think about my life and the direction I wanted to follow. A friend told me providentially about Anta Akhi. The more I heard about it, the more I realized how much it was what I was looking for: learning to live in joy, learning to love, to pray, to put Jesus at the heart of our lives. I also wanted to live alongside my Oriental brothers and discover their way of living their faith.

Every day that passes, I felt, like growing up realizing how little I was and that the gifts I receive are made to be placed at the service of others. I have this image in mind: I imagine my soul, so small and fragile, an orphan soul in a crib surrounded by thousand cribs and I see everyone blowing this tremulous soul to give her life. The home of Mary, Queen of the impossible, for me is as a cradle of the soul raised by the waves of love in the heart of the sea of tenderness.

Meeting the people who live here, sharing our life was for me a great privilege. As the days pass, the more I find that by being with them, I'm splattered by their light, their joy, peace, beauty, and I have only one desire, to follow their path, share with them the path of life. These people (like anyone, starting with myself) are not



perfect, but I find them perfect as they are. They are the face of the fragility that our eyes cannot dodge; they shout that our world will become stronger by accepting this fragility, our world will then be reshaped and open, instead of being closed on itself.

These persons will forever live in my heart, as they make it grow day by day. They are witnesses of the invisible presence which renews and transforms hearts and wounded bodies from the moment we accept to host in us what is more vulnerable. They are the lights of our world that guide and brighten the path of the heart, the only joyful way of life that is worthwhile.



Each year Anta Akhi welcomes volunteers from Lebanon and abroad, wanting to spend time and be helpful, offering their expertise in educational, administrative, or other occupation, or seeking a place to relax, away from the artifices of our world...

In adherence to this "living together", all our search of "being useful, being productive, or doing something" fades away and leaves the space for "being happy, being a presence, being a light". Everyone can therefore grow and realize fully his humanity.
