Holy journey towards Easter! Fadi relates...

He is 41, he is deaf and blind; he is in a wheelchair, but he is happy... Happy? You may wonder how it is possible to be happy under these conditions. For Fadi, the answer is clear: Without God, it would have been impossible".

During Lent, he started to work on himself to keep on witnessing the peaceful and thankful joy he feels. He shared his own experience with us:

"During Lent, I try hard to see what I could do better, personally: I try not to lose my temper but to consider the problem well defined, and even to turn it into a source of joy... even if I sometimes fail!

When meditating on God's Word, I find it interesting to give without sounding trumpet. I prefer to offer my prayers and my gift to people who can't return the favor. Thus it takes on its full meaning. I also try to fast secretly going unnoticed, to experience the fast of the heart : when I share my testimony with schoolchildren, I try to be faithful and true about my life, considering that I'm not better than anyone else: "Look at me! I have a disability, but I'm happy !". This is not the message I wish to pass on them. It's rather: "God is everywhere present. I realize what God has given to me. Even if he doesn't heal me, I want to proclaim His Love, even if I get tired and I have to fight.

"What is my motto in life? I want to stop feeling sorry for myself, so as to avoid scaring people away. At the heart of any difficulty, which I keep to myself, I think: "God is present!



Without Him, we are not able to carry our sufferings. God still gives us life today.

"For me, Holy week remains the major event: I contemplate the sufferings Our Lord went through and I look at mines... They are minor in comparison to his. So I place them into His hands and He comforts me. Without Him, I would never have experienced such a peace .I find great consolation in the fact that my sufferings are worth being endured with our God. I rejoice and feel comforted by this belief."

When love is given

A first for Madonna!

Madonna gave Sabine, a twelve grade student, a big hug when she found out her cousin was affected by Down syndrome too and realized she hadn't seen her for a long time because she lives in Canada. Sabine was very moved and she cried: When Madonna kissed me, I think it was the most beautiful moment in my life. I cried, I wonder why, I had nothing to say, I simply cried". Then, Madonna was moved in turn: it was lunch time, she invited Sabine to sit down, took a plate, ladled soup into it, added some bread, cut vegetables... as if it was her own meal ! It was amazing to see Madonna doing so, preparing and serving food to Sabine...



Among the love initiatives led by a small team of Anta Akhi, it was Philippe's turn to do something he liked. He told Rita:"Since my childhood, I have dreamt about going to this restaurant. My wish has been granted! I felt much tenderness. I had a lot of fun! Last night, I woke up several times, thinking back about the evening! I wonder how I could return the favor !". Rita replied: "By keeping confident in our true love for you!"

Joseph, a devoted, faithful and humble man.

He doesn't realize all the good he does to everyone : to Ghassan, when he finds a comfortable position for his hand; to Gharib, when he feeds him; to Fadi, who is hard-of-hearing, when he prays the Rosary at his side, using sign language as best as he can... As far as young ones are concerned, he is never short of of examples. With the staff too, especially with Geneviève whom he pays particular attention

Every day he comes to pay her a visit, offering his help to make some copies or deliver the mail and, above all, praying with her. Joseph is a real "breath of fresh air" in Geneviève's daily life. She is particularly moved by his loyalty and attention: With Joseph by her side, she definitely won't forget to take her medicine!

Children's presents which make a difference:

Little Iyad's dad wanted his son to experience the joy of sharing. On his 5th birthday, Iyad agreed not to receive any present from his parents; he turned it into a gift to the people in need. Thus, his dad provided us with 1,800\$... 300\$ were given by friends'parents who, deeply moved by Iyad's action, wanted to take part.





On her 10th birthday, during Lent, Cléa told her mother: "Well, Mom, I don't want any birthday present; there are many poor people in the world and I want to help these people in need as best as I can." Thus, all the guests were asked to turn their usual present into a modest contribution. The money collected was divided among two charities and Anta Akhi is going to receive 400\$.

A new adventure begins... in Togo

Since 2013, Anta Akhi has been linked with the diocese of Atakpamé in Togo. This partnership started with a meeting with Bishop Nicodème Barrigah ,where Yvonne read the topic of the HVE seminar ."The Church, as a Mother and educator, is necessarily responsible for the part it plays in the growth of all God's children who have a disability, through all stages of life". This title questioned Bishop Barrigah who wished to benefit from Anta Akhi's experience in his diocese. From January 9th to22nd 2015, a small team (Yvonne, Chantal and Elisabeth) had the opportunity to spend some time there in order to confirm and think about this partnership: what are we trying to build together? What part do we play in this cooperation? During our stay, we particularly felt the presence of Mary and the Holy Spirit in the progress of our collaboration. This new project starts with the establishment of a diocesan secretariat and the launching of "laboratory" parishes . It's entirely in keeping with the initial project Anta Akhi/HVE, a project made by and for the Church.: Especially as far as parish life is concerned, we should take consideration the growth of all God's children, especially those with self-care limits due to their disabilities.





Bishop Barrigah and the priests in his team wished that we could meet all relevant actors (some clergy members, groups of lay people...) and visit parishes and seminaries. At every meeting, Yvonne encouraged us to change the way we look at other people, in order to become aware of the fact that everyone is worth and important in the heart and eyes of Jesus alive, His Father and His Mother.
